It also plays an important advisory role on setting out directions, strategic development and quality assurance mechanisms for VTC's programmes.

Hong Kong Maritime and Port Board

Port and shipping have always been major tenets of Hong Kong's economy. To drive their further development, the Government established the Hong Kong Maritime and Port Board (HKMPB) on 1 April 2016. Chaired by the Secretary for Transport and Housing, HKMPB comprises industry figures to work together to formulate strategies, devise initiatives and organise activities to take Hong Kong's maritime and port industries from strength to strength.
